

A Note From Jeremy Olds, Sunday Times

Confession: Before attending this year's Romance Writers of New Zealand conference, I had never read a romance novel.

One of the great things about my jobs is I get to experience worlds I am totally unfamiliar with, and when I saw an advertisement for the conference, I saw it as a chance to learn about something new.

So, with few expectations, I went along to what ended up being a crash course in all things romance publishing. The more people I spoke to, the more I became interested in the field – the hardworking writers and the voracious

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readers; the big money the industry generates; the gender politics involved. I hadn't expected it to be so complex. Needless to say, it was very difficult to distil my three days in to one article.

When I reflect on why I hadn't read a romance book until that weekend, Professor Pamela Regis' argument seems to apply. In her book A *Natural History of the Romance Novel*, she says men have a much more difficult time picking up a book targeted at women, than women do picking up one targeted at men. "It is difficult to understand a kind of literature you do not read," Regis writes. I think she's right. Lesson learned.

An enormous thank you to Kamy and everyone who spared a minute to talk to me. For the record, I've now read one romance – *Reunited… in Paris!* By Sue McKay. May there be many more.






